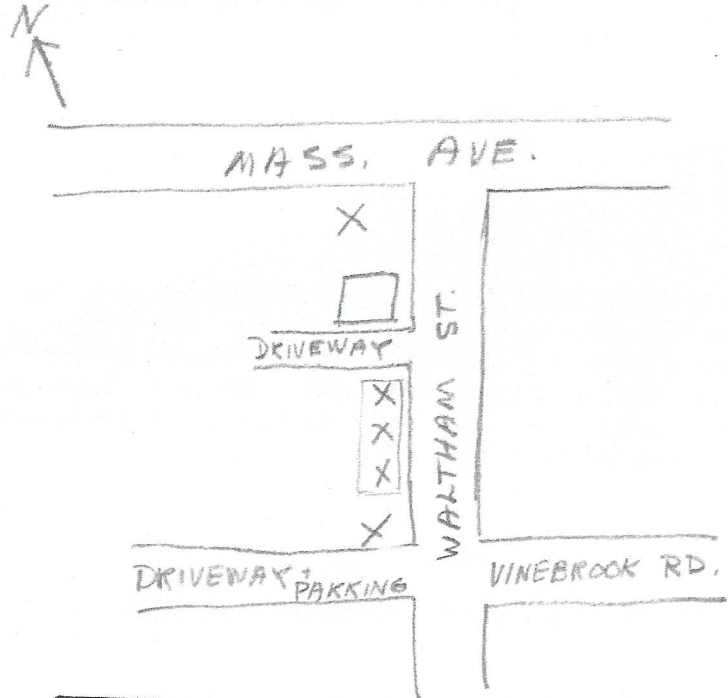

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Originally on NW corner Mass. Ave. & Waltham St. Moved in 1903 when new Hunt block constructed.
 There as early as 1830 on Muzzey land. Bought by Geo. W. Robinson 1850. Sold to Lewis Hunt, 1883. Occupied by Dr. J. O. Tilton, then used as a drug store. Moved in 1903 when turned it around & moved it back to present location.

right corner, carved, painted; front door triangular pediment, fluted pilasters-may be old, door itself removed to create ~~to~~ store entrances in old stair porch. Hip roof. 2nd floor level clapboards w. beveled ends; windows 6 x 6. Ell on left (Munroe Tavern) 5 bay block at right angles to street block. Center chimney hip roof. Beveled clapboards. Door w. recessed paneled pilasters, fanlight over door only. no side lights. Entablature surrounding fanlight; granite post at SW corner of building.
