SUMMARY:

If Town Meeting votes on March 21 to appropriate funds for renovations and additions to the two Middle Schools, the Board of Selectmen will consider whether to exclude the financing of these projects from the limits of Proposition 2 1/2 (i.e., Debt Exclusion). In addition, the Board will be considering whether to include in a potential Debt Exclusion question(s) the appropriations previously approved by Town Meeting for the school facilities master plan, design and engineering and elementary school modular classrooms.

Two Debt Exclusion question options are presented: 1) a single Debt Exclusion question for all of the school projects (elementary and middle schools); and 2) two Debt Exclusion questions (one question related to the elementary school project and one question related to the middle school projects)

Bond Counsel has reviewed and approved these proposed Debt Exclusion questions.

- Sidewalks (material & width)
- Street Lighting (style)
- Buffers (stone walls, thin planters etc.)
- Seating (benches, tables, chairs)
- Bicycle amenities (racks, loops)
- Informational Signage
- Trash/Recycle Receptacles
- Planters (type, location)
- Landscaping (trees, shrubs, soil used)
- Educational and Interpretive Elements (wayfinding, historical interpretive signage, markers, bollards, fencing etc.)
- Maintenance and upkeep

- 2. Provide evidence to the Town Clerk that the appointee has completed the on-line training requirement required by the Conflict of Interest statute. Further, to continue to serve on the Committee, the member must acknowledge every two years completion of the on-line training requirement.


